Macy's Great Christmas Tree







527	504	10B Incidents: Decreased by -4%. There is a myriad of reasons for this decrease including cold weather, police presence and increased street activation.




Contracted Hours vs Worked Hours




Calls for Service by Type






Narrative summary

With the holiday shopping season approaching, Legion Security Officers have been working hard to make the Union Square district a safe clean area for all to enjoy. We have focused on areas of concern such as the Union Square Park, as well continuing our efforts in making commercial storefronts free and clear of encampments and loiters. Identifying and addressing quality of life concerns help in the process of making the district a safer place. With the addition of the day shift patrol, Legion guards have been able to focus 24/7 on quality-of-life issues such as sit/lie violations, illegal dumping; as well as any individual partaking if nefarious activity such as drinking alcohol and narcotic usage in public. These are a few of the problems Legion guards face on a daily basis. With an increased security presence within the District and steadfast effort, we look forward to curbing the majority of these quality of life issues facing the Union Square District.

On November 11th, at approximately 11:34 am, Legion Security Officer Stone observed a theft from a store in progress.
